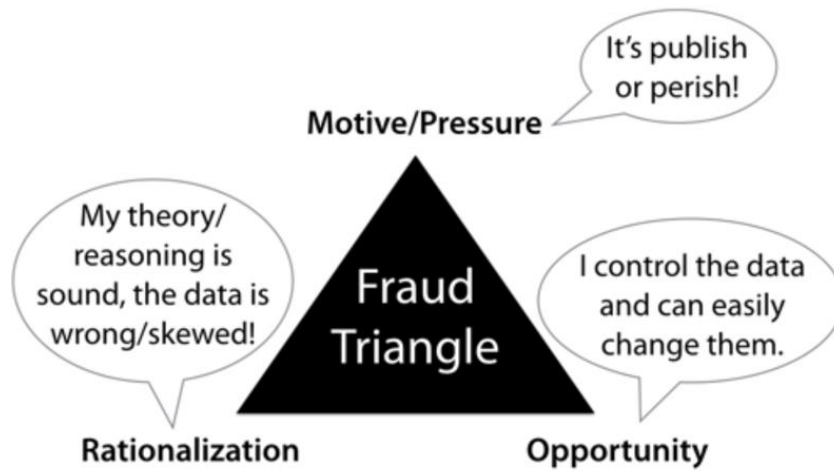

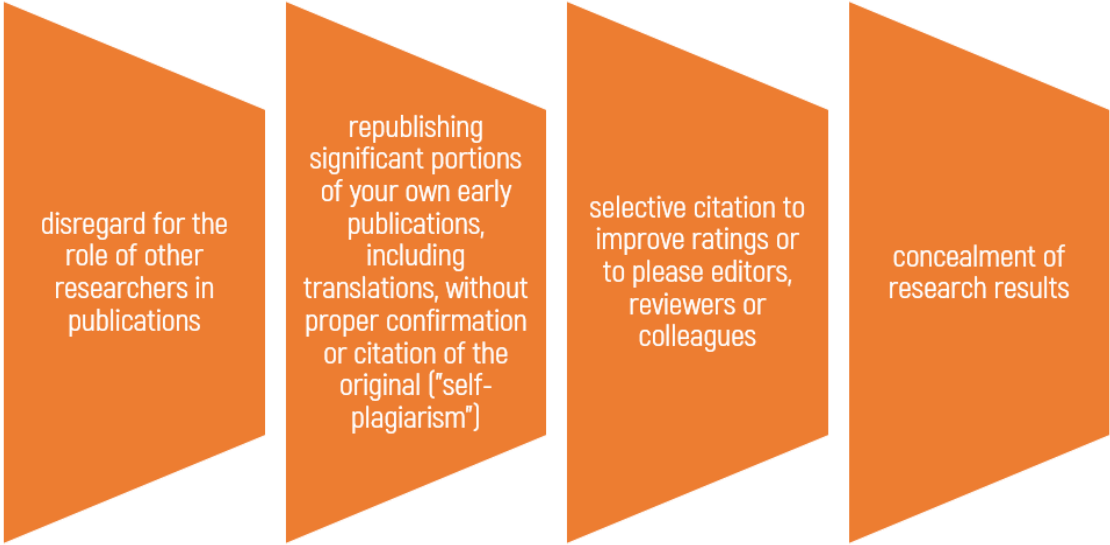

## Violations of Research Integrity

giving sponsors the opportunity to jeopardize the independence of the research process or to communicate the results in a way to formulate or disseminate a biased view of the research

optional extension of the research bibliography

malicious accusation of the researcher of committing a misdemeanor (crime) or other violations

distortion of scientific achievements

## Violations of Research Integrity

exaggeration of the importance and practical significance of the results

delay or unnecessary work complication of other researchers (sabotage)

abuse of authority to encourage violations of research integrity

ignoring alleged violations of research integrity, or covering up misconduct (crime) or other violations

creation or maintenance of journals that neglect research quality control ("predatory journals")
