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**UNEXPECTED ALLIES: THE CONSTRUCTIVE ROLE  
OF WRITING CENTRES AMIDST THE RISE OF GENAI  
AND ACADEMIC INTEGRITY CHALLENGES**

With the rise of GenAI, a significant paradigm shift has erupted in the knowledge sector. Information processing and production is undergoing significant changes, which is reverberating through the higher education sector. Naturally, academic integrity has become a major concern for all higher education sectors. However, what academic misconduct is in the current climate has many resemblances to how it was formulated pre-GenAI. Ranging from skills or knowledge deficits to intentional misconduct it occurs due to a variety of educational deficits. Cheating and transgressing with GenAI likely stems from the same deficits. As a result, within our Institution, the Writing Centre has become a key player in academic integrity development. The Writing Centre hosts the Face-to-Face Academic Integrity Workshop (FAIW), which is the final step of the Institutional remedial training programme for students referred for policy transgressions. This show-and-tell presentation will discuss the initial development of the FAIW intervention and anecdotal data on the first year of implementation. We will discuss the following main findings: (1) technical knowledge, understanding, and capability in using AI; (2) academic pressures that potentially translate to misuse of GenAI; and (3) ambiguity surrounding the guidelines and expectations for GenAI use in assignments. Participants will be shown examples of the workshop materials, such as interactive exercises, student reflection prompts, and anonymized fictitious case studies used to foster understanding of GenAI-related misconduct.

Attendees will gain insights into the key elements of integrity workshops, strategies for student engagement, and practical approaches of how writing centres can contribute to institutional academic integrity practices.

**Introduction.** During the COVID-19 pandemic and martial law in Ukraine, the educational process in Ukraine was provided by the use of remote learning technologies.
